Genealogy is a record of, who is in a family, and who they are related to.


More and more **Luitwielers** are eager to learn about our family genealogy.

From before 1580, it was hard to secure the relevant information and create the data bank, i.e. we obtained the information from old Family Bibles and Church Archives

However, with the internet we can trace our genealogy more readily.

The required data is each **Luitwieler's** full name, date and place of birth, marriage and death.

There have always been members of the family who have kept the data bank current. The data will never be complete, because there is always new information to be added.



The "leasehold land" was around the Parish of **Lütwile** (Canton Aargau), located between the "leasehold land" of another Herr Meier (probably the father of our Herr Walther Meier) and the "leasehold land" of a Herr Rudolf Schenker. The cost of the "leasehold" amounted to 12 pfennigs (pennies) per year. **The piece is dated July 12**, **1273**.

Raised to the landed gentry, he would in the future be known as Walther von Lütwile.

He was the first Leutwiler, Leutwyler, Luitwieler, Lietwiler, Luitweiler in history.

From 1580 on there was more data that become available and was identified as being large branches to the family tree:

The Coat of Arms "von Lüttwyl"

Our family coat of arms is found in the book "Coat of Arms displaying Old and New Royalty" of the 13 Swiss Cantons, written by Niclaus Gachet in 1799.

The coat of arms of "von Lüttwyl" displays the claw of a lion. The claw seems to resemble the claw in the coat of arms of the Royal House von Habsburg. So it is not the claw of an eagle as many believe it to be. There is mention of both spellings in the book, v. Lüttwil and v. Lüttwyl.

It is assumed that the Leutwil men (from Canton Aargau) were granted the right to use part of the von Habsburg coat of arms (also from Canton Aargau) because of their services as ministerial officials for the Royal House von Habsburg. We believe that the idea is not that farfetched, since we know that the two families had close ties and originated from the same Canton.



The battle at Sempach (Canton Luzerne) took place in 1386. The battle was fought between the soldiers of the Old Swiss Confederacy and the Austrians. In the Sempach War Chapel on the list of fallen soldiers for the von Habsburg side, there is the name "der Lüttwiler". According to this he was a knight in the von Habsburg army.

We cannot prove that we go back in direct lineage to the bearer of this coat of arms. But we can use the original "von Lüttwyl" coat of arms without any qualms.

History of the Swiss Mercenary

Johannes Lütweiler/Luitwieler, born in Lupfig, Switzerland, on 27 March 1718, was a **Mercenary Soldier** in the Berner Regiment of Switzerland. He and his Regiment arrived in Vlissingen (Flushing in English), the Netherlands in 1742. This man is the patriarch of all the Dutch, USA and Canadian Luitwielers.

History tells us that the Swiss were among the most sought-after **mercenary forces** for half a millennium. Over a million Swiss mercenary soldiers fought on the battlefields of Europe. They were renowned for their brutality and boldness, which made them much coveted and feared in equal measure. They served as mercenary soldiers for almost every European power. At one stage, 1 in 3 in the French army's infantry actually came from Switzerland, and in the 19th century, liberation movements were often confronted with Swiss troops serving royal dynasties in decline. Today's Swiss Guard at the Vatican started out like that a long time ago. However, Swiss mercenaries of old are a far cry from the idyllic image of the modern-day papal Swiss Guard as an historic relic.

Probably no other phenomenon had a stronger influence on pre-modern Switzerland than its mercenaries. There is little general awareness of this extraordinary historical phenomenon. No other country has had that history.

In one respect, it was a "dirty business", one that established an aristocracy founded on the mercenary trade and wielding political power. On the other hand, the long periods abroad resulted in a transfer of knowledge because those who managed to return home in good health and perhaps even with some prosperity brought culture and knowledge from many foreign countries with them.

The country of Switzerland would not have survived without its foreign mercenaries. The fact is that the courts of Europe had become so dependent on Swiss troops that they refrained from attacking this supply line of soldiers. The Swiss were able to call their troops home whenever they needed them for themselves and so a mechanism was practised here that gradually became an ever stronger commitment to neutrality.



The Year is 1836, The Luitwielers are leaving for America.

The US is a Nation of immigrants.

The second wave of immigration from Europe began in the 1820s and continued for the next 50 years. During that time span, nearly 7.5 million newcomers arrived in the US.

Most of the immigrants were motivated to leave their homeland because of religious ideals, persecution, poverty, famine, lacking economic opportunities, and other related reasons. They were all looking for a better life.

We might ask, what motivated the Luitwielers to leave their homeland? What was life in their homeland like?

To answer these questions, we present what information we have in order that you will appreciate the place from which they came, and the situation existing there in the early to mid 1830s.

The Luitwielers lived in Zeeland, the south-western Province of the Netherlands.

In the context of place and time, we need to point out here that Zeeland has special meaning and importance for our analysis, because the situation there in the 1830s was not all that good. We will examine the push-factors of religious conservatism, social and economic conditions, and the eternal struggle against the rising waters.

Religious Conservatism

The most important characteristic of Zeeland was its religious conservatism. Protestants there had the reputation for being conservatives and traditionalists. Zeelanders were genuine Calvinists and defenders of the old Creeds.

By the 1830s, the elders in the national Dutch Reformed Church (DRC) had become quite disturbed by the spirit of unbelief and rationalism within its congregations. They blamed the Enlightenment for this. What did the elders do about it? They "protested" against the liberal thinking, and they did so to the point where in the mid 1830s the movement gained a name, the Secession. A kind of Second Reformation was born.

The Seceders walked away from the DRC. They started their own Christian Reformed Church (CRC). The deep split between the two groups, the DRC on the one hand and the CRC on the other, became more amplified as a result of the Dutch law of the day. The Government recognized by law only the DRC. That meant the CRC could not keep, use or occupy property of the national DRC. Moreover, the CRC were not allowed to worship involving groups of more than 20 people, and would be fined or even imprisoned for breaking the law.

The result of this restrictive law was that some Zeelanders were becoming more convinced that emigration to the US might be a good idea, in order to escape abuse and mistreatment. However, the Seceder leaders all strongly opposed emigration at first.

They raised a number of fears to their faithful about going to the US. The Indians might kill them, the climate was too harsh, doctors too scarce, land too expensive, and the roads were so poor, they would be cut off forever from contact with family and friends back home. Additionally, they said, the US was also coming under the same sinful thinking of the Enlightenment as had been the case back home, thanks to leaders like Washington, Jefferson and Franklin.

Our own family records suggest that some of the Luitwielers were part of the orthodox Seceder or CRC group. They may have suffered more than mere verbal abuse. Moving to the US would certainly have afforded them the religious freedom they wanted.

The ones who emigrated to the US certainly found religious peace there. We know they played an important role in the founding of the Christian Reformed Church of America (in Dutch: Gereformeerde Kerk).

Social and Economic Conditions

There were other push-factors as well.

Zeeland consisted of an array of diked islands lying in the estuaries of Europe's greatest rivers, the Rhine, Maas, and Schelde. The swift-flowing waterways in this large delta region made travel difficult between the islands, and cut the inhabitants off from the mainland. The Zeelanders were living in small island towns and villages in a state of almost complete isolation. The Luitwielers lived in the town of Vlissingen (Flushing) on Walcheren Island.

Zeeland was a mostly agrarian society where nearly 60 percent of the population worked the soil. The soils were heavy sea clay where the farmers either raised cash crops of wheat or specialized in dairying. Crop failures were frequent, tenancy rates were high, and land ownership was impossible to hope for or achieve.

The wheat farmers were able to prosper by modernizing their operations and buying new machines, such as the McCormick reapers. This meant laying off excess day laborers and other help. In more than a few of the villages in 1849, the unemployed comprised 20 percent of the population and times were bad.

Zeeland had alarming death rates due to its notoriously polluted drinking water, and the widespread resistance to scientific advances, such as small pox vaccinations. The Luitwieler families suffered terrible infant losses. Before their leaving for the US, **Huybreght** Luitwieler C.4.7. had 10 children of which 3 died in infancy. Brother **Hendrik** Luitwieler C.4.9. had 10 children and the first 9 died in infancy.

The Luitwielers were owners of a paints and dry goods business. The business was carried on from father to son for over 150 years. For any type of shop operation to remain in the same family this long would perhaps suggest that business must have been good all the time. Not necessarily true. It is not at all unreasonable to surmise that the aforementioned push-factors could have tipped the scale for some Luitwielers to emigrate.

Luctor et Emergo - Battling the Waters

The final push-factor in favour of emigration was the frequent flooding of the land.

For the past 2000 plus years, the inhabitants of the Netherlands have often had to cope with flood disasters. The name "Netherlands" gives a clue to the problem: "Nether" means "low". It literally means "The Low Countries".

One of the worst areas has always been Zeeland. Every time a storm developed in the North Atlantic and stirred up the waves, the coastal areas would become flooded. This happened frequently. In the early 1800s, the floods of 1820, 1825 and 1836 took a terrible toll in lives and property.

Zeeland's official Coat of Arms shows a lion half-emerged from water with the text in Latin "Luctor et Emergo" for "I do battle courageously and I rise forth from the water".

The constant struggle against the rising seas and flood waters has undoubtedly shaped the Zeeland character.

Zeeland's official song is clear on that: the Zeelanders are a loyal, proud, self-reliant, independent, determined people, steadfast to the core.


Emigration to America

In conclusion, it is likely that as a result of religious turmoil and other push-factors, the emigration of Luitwielers from Zeeland was inevitable.

In 1836, three Luitwieler brothers and a sister left for America.

The Luitwielers sailing to America in 1836 took their **Old 1775 Bible** with them.

RULING THE WORLD OF MONEY

Ten times a year - once a month except in August and October - a small group of well dressed men arrives in Basel, Switzerland. Carrying overnight bags and attaché cases, they discreetly check into the Euler Hotel, across from the railroad station. They have come to this sleepy city from places as disparate as Tokyo, London, and Washington, for the regular meeting of the most exclusive, secretive, and powerful supranational club in the world. The Chairman of the club is Fritz Leutwiler.

Each of the dozen or so visiting members has his own office at the club, with secure telephone lines to his home country. The members are fully serviced by a permanent staff of about 300, including chauffeurs, chefs, guards, messengers, translators, stenographers, secretaries, and researchers. Also at their disposal are a brilliant research unit and an ultramodern computer, as well as a secluded country club with tennis courts and a swimming pool, a few kilometres outside of Basel.

The membership of this club is restricted to a handful of powerful men who determine daily the interest rate, the availability of credit, and the money supply of the banks in their own countries. They include the governors of the U.S. Federal Reserve, the Bank of England, the Bank of Japan, the Swiss National Bank, and the German Bundesbank. The club controls a bank with a \$40 billion kitty in cash, government securities, and gold that constitutes about one tenth of the world's available foreign exchange.

The profits earned just from renting out its hoard of gold (second only to that of Fort Knox in value) are more than sufficient to pay for the expenses of the entire organization. And the unabashed purpose of its elite monthly meetings is to coordinate and, if possible, to control all monetary activities in the industrialized world. The place where this club meets in Basel is a unique financial institution called the Bank for International Settlements - or more simply, and appropriately, the BIS (pronounced "biz" in German).

The BIS was originally established in May 1930 by bankers and diplomats of Europe and the United States to collect and disburse Germany's World War I reparation payments (hence its name). It was truly an extraordinary arrangement.

Although the BIS was organized as a commercial bank with publicly held shares, its immunity from government interference - and taxes - in both peace and war was guaranteed by an international treaty signed in The Hague in 1930.

Although all its depositors are central banks, the BIS has made a profit on every transaction. And because it has been highly profitable, it has required no subsidy or aid from any government.

Since it also provided, in Basel, a safe and convenient repository for the gold holdings of the European central banks, it quickly evolved into the bank for central banks. As the world depression deepened in the thirties and financial panics flared up in Austria, Hungary, Yugoslavia, and Germany, the governors in charge of the key central banks feared that the entire global financial system would collapse unless they could closely coordinate their rescue efforts. The obvious meeting spot for this desperately needed coordination was the BIS, where they regularly went anyway to arrange gold swaps and war-damage settlements.

Dr. Fritz Leutwiler died in May 1997.

Well-known Zeelanders (from the Province of Zeeland in Holland):

ZEELAND's Claes Maartenszen van Rosenvelt, the DUTCH immigrant ancestor of the Roosevelt family, arrived in New Amsterdam (present day New York City) some time between 1638 and 1649.

Claes' son Nicholas was the first to use the spelling Roosevelt and the first to hold political office, as an alderman.

His children Johannes and Jacobus were, respectively, the progenitors of the Oyster Bay and Hyde Park branches of the family that emerged in the 18th century.

By the late 19th century, the Hyde Park Roosevelts were generally associated with the Democratic Party and the Oyster Bay Roosevelts with the Republican Party. President Theodore Roosevelt, an Oyster Bay Roosevelt, was President Franklin Roosevelt's fifth cousin.

Despite political differences that led family members to actively campaign against each other, the two branches generally remained friendly. Franklin Roosevelt married Eleanor Roosevelt, Theodore's niece and his own fifth cousin once removed. James Roosevelt met his wife at a Roosevelt family gathering in the home of Theodore's mother.
